VISITING MUSIC TEACHER (WOODWIND)

Line Manager: Director of Music

Notice period: Half a term

Paid hours per week:

1 day per week during term-time – with the possibility for this to increase further.

Hours for this role are dependent on the requirements of the School and as agreed in advance with the Visiting Music Teacher.

Attendance at relevant training sessions at Staff Inset Days will also be required.

Main Tasks

Music Tuition

- Providing 1:1 and small group music tuition to pupils for woodwind lessons. To include flute, recorder, clarinet and or / saxophone.
- Ensuring all pupils reach their full potential by delivering engaging and dynamic lessons to the correct standard for every individual pupil.
- Demonstrating correct techniques and performance skills to pupils.
- Preparing pupils for external music exams and music scholarship applications.
- Ensuring proper supervision of pupils during lesson time and ensuring they comply with School rules and Behaviour policies.

Musical Groups & Events

- Supporting musical events within the School as agreed with the Director of Music.
- Running and overseeing ensembles for pupils of various ages and abilities in agreement with the Director of Music.
- Preparing pupils for musical performances, concerts and school events.

Report Writing

- Providing reports for all pupils in line with the School's reporting cycles and deadlines.
- Ensuring reports are well written and proofread and submitted ready for uploading to the School system.

School Policies & Procedures

- To familiarise self with all the general policies across the school and ensure procedures are followed.
- To behave professionally and confidentially with regards to matters of Pinewood and to uphold the traditions and ethos that Pinewood holds dear.
